“ I had the privilege to know Ron, as we both coached baseball and basketball together for 4 and 3 years respectively. Ron, or "Pa" as most referred to him, was a great guy to be around. Full of energy and spirit, his deep voice would boom across the ball field or gym cheering on our team and his grandsons, Hunter and Christian. I got to see Ron primarily in the role of "coach". Obviously in that role he would talk to the team about what the kids did well, or could have improved upon after a game. Maybe he would vent at an umpire or referee during a game, and get animated, or tell the team a joke about something funny that occurred in between innings or at halftime. But above all else, and what will always stick with me, was that Ron was a teacher. He'd coral our baseball team after each practice and give the team a homework assignment about a historical question about the game of baseball for the kids to answer. He'd ask them to find out how many homeruns Babe Ruth had in his career, or who was the all time hits leader. He wanted the boys not only to play the game of baseball, but understand it. Appreciate it for its history. He wanted the boys to be successful on the field, but also be educated about the game they were playing. In that sense, it was clear that Ron didn't do anything half way. He'd schedule extra practices because the league didn't 'get us enough field time for practice'. So he would literally find another ball field in town for the kids to get in an extra practice during the week.

The dedication Ron showed as a coach, I could see through social media, carried through in the rest of his life as a husband, father, grandfather, friend and so much more. To Roxie, Ryan, Hunter, Christian, and Irelyn-we know how special "Pa" was, and if you need anything we are here for you.
