Joseph M. Osiecki, 80 years, of West Milford, NJ, passed away at his home on Thursday, November 28, 2024.

He was born on December 22, 1943 in Chicago, Illinois to Eugenia (nee Zalewski) and Anthony Osiecki.

Joseph met his future wife Mary Beth in New York City. They married in 1990 and resided in West Milford, NJ and enjoyed living "in the country".

Joseph was highly intelligent and could engage in conversation about almost any topic though telecommunications and computers were his passion.

He worked on computers for close to 45 years, since the days when a computer took up the whole room. He worked for all the major banks and financial houses in the New York area at one time or another, besides spending time in both advertising (Interpublic Group) and with oil companies (Caltex). He spent several years working overseas in many countries including Bahrain, Thailand and the Philippines. Joseph taught at almost

every level, grades 5 through graduate courses, influencing many students along the way.

For over 25 years Joseph worked almost full time on a volunteer basis to maintain the 70 plus computers in Our Lady Queen of Peace School and Parish in Hewitt, NJ until they closed; supporting communications and technology and serving as a consultant on “all things computer”.

In his spare time, he enjoyed traveling and working in the yard with his beloved wife Mary Beth.

Joseph’s light, his wit and quirky sense of humor will never be forgotten.

He was predeceased by his parents Eugenia in April 1988 and Anthony in October 1988.

Joseph is survived by his beloved wife Mary Beth; and his cousins Patricia Douglas and her husband Scott, and Barbara Kania.
