



MORENO STACCIOLI

March 3, 1930 - May 2, 2013

Moreno Staccioli, 83, of Oak Ridge, passed away on Thursday, May 2, 2013. He was born in Cascina, Italy.

Mr. Staccioli trained as an apprentice woodworker in Italy as a young boy of eight years old in the family business. While living in the U.S. he started his own business in custom cabinetry and fine furniture, where his talents grew as an artisan, carver and a painter.

Mr. Staccioli served in the Italian Army as an Artillery Specialist. He married the love of his life, Anne Maria in Italy in 1954. He immigrated to the United States in 1957 and they raised their three children on Cozy Lake, in the Milton/Oak Ridge section of Jefferson Township, NJ.

Mr. Staccioli proudly became a United States citizen in 1963.

He was a parishioner and a past member of the Knights of Columbus at St. Thomas the Apostle RC Church in Oak Ridge.

Moreno will best be remembered as an avid gardener and outdoorsman. His greatest joys in life were spending time with his family around the dinner table, vacationing at the Jersey Shore, relaxing on Cozy Lake Beach, visiting family on trips to Italy and meeting friends at the coffee shop. Some of his family's fondest memories of him include his 'steel-trap memory' that often resulted in long and detailed oral family history lessons, and his operatic song outbursts.

Mr. Staccioli was predeceased by his beloved wife Anne in 2011.

He is survived by his dear daughters Danielle and her husband Brian Vayda of Fredon, and Marisa Stratton and her husband Steve of Hewitt, and his dear

son Marc Staccioli and his wife Donna along with his adored grandson Lucas of Oak Ridge, as well as many cousins in Italy.

A memorial service will take place 10 a.m., Saturday, May 11, 2013 at St. Thomas the Apostle RC Church, 5635 Berkshire Valley Road, Oak Ridge, NJ 07435.
